Caravaggio's career in Italy differed greatly from that of Gentileschi's. During her lifetime, she had overcome Original Sin with the help of her son. The Archconfraternity took issue subsequently and fled Rome in order to escape execution. Her acceptance into the Accademia del Disegno was a massive personal and professional achievement.

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Above all, the confraternity assisted needy and sick bakers and their families, providing them with bread, shelter, and sickbeds. The Great Masters learned to describe this translucency using not so much different colored paints set side by side but successive translucent layers of paint carefully superimposed on one. Beginning on November 24, hours were extended until 7 p.m.

He had a remarkable ability to bring his paintings intensely and joyously alive. In the 17th century, Anton Raphael Mengs decided that Caravaggio "was thoroughly defective in disegno" and that his and his followers' pictures "make a strong impression on the senses but nothing on the spirit; they leave it as they found it." Eduard Manet. This is not the amateur's fault, it's the camera's.

Could it be that Caravaggio when he had arrived in Rome very soon noticed the norms and atmosphere in the palaces of the nobility and upper classes, where a high culture was imbued with sophisticated pleasure including sexuality according to norms we so far know very little about?
